



Sports Premium

Our school received £9,205 in funding through the Sports Premium for the 2015/2016 academic year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The money will be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability.

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Bradford Primary Academy we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.
